To promote to Supervisor:

- \$700 personal net sales for the 2 consecutive months preceding your promotion
- \$2000 net sales from you and your group for the same 2 months
- Sponsor 5 Bronze recruits (Bronze = \$750 net sales in their incentive period.)
- Sponsor 5 Active recruits (Active = \$350 net sales in the past 3 months.) These may be same as the Bronze recruits.
- Submit the Supervisor agreement.

To achieve MACH 10, promote to Supervisor by the 1st of the month following your qualifying date.

Your qualifying date is the end of your 12 week incentive period. So, if your qualifying date is December 12th, November and December are the 2 consecutive months for the \$700 personal and \$2000 group sales & 5 Bronze for your January 1st MACH 10 promotion to Supervisor.

2. Schedule several shows and events within your first 4 weeks.
3. Sponsor some more people who want to do this, too.
